## Comment:

Around 13 per cent of all social rented dwellings in Wales were supported and sheltered housing units. However, the number of units of sheltered housing recorded is a decrease of 1,540 units of sheltered housing or 5.7% from 31 March 2015. This is mainly due to the recategorisation of a large number of sheltered housing as general needs housing in one authority.

With regard to the supply of extra care housing, there has been a 2.6% increase in overall supply. Furthermore, almost all of the social rented extra care housing was managed by RSLs (99%), with only 25 extra care properties owned by local authorities at 31 March 2016.

There is no information on other tenure choices in sheltered or extra care housing owned by councils or housing associations eg leasehold or shared ownership.
