FUNDED PHD STUDENTSHIP

The Open University and the Museum of the Home are pleased to announce the availability of a fully funded Collaborative doctoral studentship October 2024 under the AHRC's Collaborative Doctoral Partnerships (CDP) scheme.

WRAPPING UP PROBIN INTERVIEWS

The ABAJ community Co-researchers have worked incredibly hard to complete 72 of the 80 Probin interviews before the start of Ramadan. The Subco Trust in Newham and Sonali gardens in Tower Hamlets have been instrumental in arranging interviews with their service users at the centres. The community of transcribers have also been diligently transcribing the interviews and 34 interview transcriptions have been completed.

The ABAJ team are are anonymising the transcripts and introduced the process of analysis, using some of the anonymised transcripts, with the BRAG members at the 5th BRAG meeting on 2nd March 2024.
