


One-to-one support

The service users





- 68 referred couples to the centres and 36 individuals to 1-1 service
- 46 couples have attended Day Care sessions and 19 individuals have received 1-1 support
- The referred people come from different cultural and ethnic backgrounds:
- Most of the participants have diagnosis of Alzheimer's Disease, some vascular dementia, some mixed dementia and two have young onset dementia


The service users who attended the sessions and received 1-1 service (November 2016 - November 2017)




Geographical Area by Borough


