- 1700 Almshouse charities -Most 1634 members of TAA
- 36,000 live in Almshouses
- Unique legal status/1,000 year history/valued historic buildings
- 75% have less than 20 units
- 90% good or excellent accommodation
- 200 at risk estimated 50 charities failing
- Anecdotal feedback points to Almshouses adding value to life Research on going (Alison Pooley/Jenny Pannell) more is needed and underway (The Mercers Company)
- 65% don't know what almshouses are of those that do 78% think they are good and we should build more.
