Charter – our four actions for change

- 1. Government to create a more comprehensive and integrated national and local planning and policy framework for supported housing for people with a learning disability and autism.
- 2. Government to create the conditions for growth of supply by allocating a proportion of the new affordable homes programme to new housing for people with learning disability and autism.
- 3. A social housing rent standard that supports the commissioning and funding of new supported housing for people with high support needs.
- 4. A long-term sustainable, consistent housing benefit regime for supported housing.
