# Archbishops' Commission on Reimagining Care

### Statement of Commission's purpose

Developing a radical and inspiring vision, drawing on Christian theology and tradition, that reimagines care and support.





#### Aims of the Commission

- ► To generate an inspiring long-term vision for care and support for people in later life and adults with disability or long-term conditions in England, underpinned by a renewed set of values and principles.
- ► To offer radical as well as practical recommendations to government and wider society about how to deliver this vision for care.
- ► To address wider issues that impact the status and well-being of those with care needs as a result of age, disability or ill health.
- ▶ To propose areas for further action by the Church of England, learning from other denominations and faith communities, on ways to help people with care and support needs, those in later life or with disabilities, live well in the community enjoying full citizenship.

#### Workstreams

- 1. The theology and enduring ethical values underpinning our understanding of care and support
- 2. Systems of care and support: users and carers (paid and unpaid)

- 3. The role of church, faith groups and communities in care and support
- 4. The principles for public policy, funding and reform necessary for implementing the vision

- October December 2021: Shaping the vision
- ▶ January 2021 March 2022: Care in action
- ► April June 2022: Making it a reality
- **▶** July- September 2022: Sharing our conclusions
- **▶** October-December 2022: Creating impact
