What is this research about?

Hearing from the older Bangladeshi community (aged 50 +) in East London about their

- Lived experiences of home housing and neighbourhood and its implications for wellbeing;
- Factors influencing these experiences;
- Expectations and aspirations that enable living and ageing well
- Dynamics of multigenerational living involving family interviews

Why undertake research with this community?

- A group that is living with entrenched housing and health inequalities
- Bangladeshi households are more likely to live in non-decent housing (24%) than White British households
- Housing tenure Likely to be social and private renters
- Limited attention to cultural diversity
- Peoples' own perspectives and voices are missing







Community Co-researchers

- 6 people recruited from the community aged 18 years and above (both women and men)
- Paid roles jointly recruited by BHA and OU
- Trained in research ethics and interviewing skills by the academic team
- Undertake interviews with Bangladeshi Probin in Sylheti, Bengali and English as required with support from the Research partnership.
