Retirement Housing

Also known as sheltered housing, retirement flats or communities

> Offers self-contained homes for sale, shared-ownership or rent.

Part-time warden and emergency call systems. Typically no meals provided.

Typical facilities available:

- Communal lounge
- Gardens
- Laundry facilities Guest room

Typically 40 - 60 homes.



Also known as extra care, retirement villages, housing-with-care, assisted living or independent living




Offers self-contained homes for sale, shared-ownership or rent.





24-hour onsite staff. Optional care or domiciliary services available. Restaurant / Cafe available for meals.

Typical facilities available:

- Restaurant and Café
- Leisure Club including: gym, swimming pool, exercise
- class programme Communal lounge and/or Library









Typically 60 - 250 homes.





Communal residential living with residents occupying individual rooms, often with an en-suite bathroom.

- Gardens










