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## Regional Adult Social Care (ASC) Market Development during the Covid 19 Pandemic Engagement Process:

- During Covid 19 Pandemic ASC mandate to identify regional priorities for care market development / transformation
- Engagement with people with lived experience of health and care service –
  became a crucial part of the process
- Appointed Curators of Change a small enterprise of people with diverse and lived experience of care and support to run a pubic engagement process
- Listened in order to learn what is working well, or not, and what is most important for new care service development using 'Making it Real' Framework, on-line workshops, story gathering and lots of listening and talking.
- Lots of feedback on housing development and the need for peoples' voices to be heard in relation to new housing development.

## **Engagement Recommendations**

- Need to create better relationships between people and more human conditions to ensure people feel valued and connected in order that the priorities make a difference for the people who use the services.
- Any actions and plans should be developed in coproduction with the people who draw on services and support.
- Moving forward ADASS East should create a level of accountability with the people who have given and continue to give time to share their stories and participate in this work.
- Proper engagement needs to be given the proper time
- Need to coproduce housing solutions together

## What has ADASS East done differently as a result of stakeholder engagement?

- A renewed commitment to coproduction across the region
- 'Over a Brew' established a series of listening events run by Curators of Change and open to all people who access care and support, families, friends and staff to focus on specific themes in order to start creating the necessary conditions for change.
- Regional Housing Group established using lessons learned from markets engagement with coproduction at its heart to develop a *Best Practice Guide to* integration, partnership working and coproduction across Housing, Adult Social Care and Health
