




% of people planning to rightsize, by age

What's important to over 50s?

What's important to over 50s?

Highest earners have the highest expectation for their asset to increase in value:

Income per annum	<£15K	£15,001- £25,000	£25,001- £35,000	£35,001- £45,000	>£45,000
Expect property value to rise	47%	43%	40%	53%	58%
