### Comment:

Around 11 per cent of all social rented dwellings in Wales continue to be sheltered housing units and around 2 per cent were extra care housing. There was little change in the overall numbers of units compared to previous years with some authority areas seeing a reduction in sheltered housing but an increase in extra care housing; for example, in Carmarthenshire.

Other interesting facts, sheltered housing accounts for 13% of all local authority stock and 75% of all extra care housing is owned by housing associations.
