New role for the Housing LIN?

As reported in our previous e-news, the Change Agent Team, including the work of the Housing LIN, is planned to become part of a new agency called the Care Service Improvement Partnership (CSIP).

CSIP will bring together a number of specialist Department of Health agencies that lead on managing change and supporting policy into practice around children and adult services. This could help strengthen the housing with care dimension under CSIP and the future work of the Housing LIN. The deadline for comments is 25 January 2005.

In the pipeline

We have commissioned a large body of work that will interest Housing LIN members. These will be issued during the year and include:

- a template for developing strategies for accommodation and care for an ageing population. This is based on "wholesystems" site work undertaken in several local economies, commissioned by the Change Agent Team
- a report on developing regional Extra Care Housing strategies. This is based on work currently being undertaken for the LIN in the Government Office region -Yorkshire and Humber
- a series of case study reports on services for people with learning disabilities, homelessness, developing intermediate care and on direct payments, tackling health inequalities and urban renewal, affordable warmth, health promotion and telecare, and
