

Key Issue 19: The impacts of housing to support people living with dementia are **under researched** in the UK.







Housing & dementia

- Growing evidence for the role of housing in improving health and wellbeing
- Home as a place of safety, familiarity and connection
- We need to know more about what works



Extra Care Housing (1)

 Model of housing with care and support that promotes independent living



- Self-contained accommodation with the onsite provision of flexible 24hour care, and access to a range of communal activities and facilities
- Over a fifth of those living in ECH have dementia (Barrett, 2020)
- Three models: integrated, specialist, separated



Extra Care Housing (2)

• Key features that help include dementia friendly design, flexible care, appropriate technology, social opportunity



- Sense of safety and security also key benefit (Barrett, 2021)
- Verbeek et al. (2019) frontline practitioner views
- Many gaps in the evidence base, particularly absence of **insight** from people living with dementia


