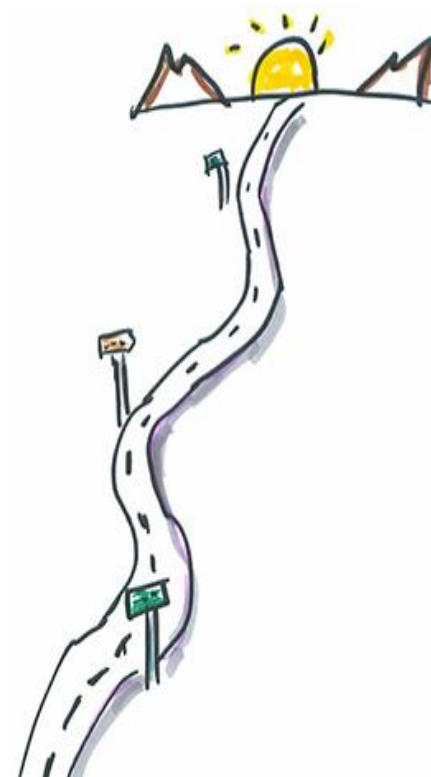

## Aims of the Commission

- **Co-produce with the sector and people with lived experience** and their families/carers, a compelling, evidence-based, long-term vision for housing that facilitates care and support
- **Recommend policy changes** to inform the Government's thinking on the Long-Term Plan for Social Care
- **Develop a roadmap** to support the implementation of the vision for residential care, including viable financial models

## Immediate priorities



### *Developing a national policy framework and building momentum for change*

#### National action

- ✓ A compelling vision and strategy for change
- ✓ Increase investment in intermediate housing with care and support options
- ✓ Rights-based legislation
- ✓ A national workforce strategy

#### Local action

- ✓ Place based housing for older people plans

## Medium term priorities



### *Developing local plans and making early improvements*

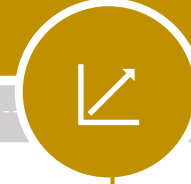
#### National action

- ✓ Changes to national planning
- ✓ Showcase and spread innovative housing with care and support options
- ✓ National campaign to increase public understanding about the benefits of housing with care and support
- ✓ Invest in information, advice and guidance
- ✓ Support a national programme to expand the use of individual service funds (ISFs)

#### Local action

- ✓ Encourage development of community-based care homes
- ✓ Developing local co-production arrangements
- ✓ Local information and advice
- ✓ Scale up and invest in shared living models
- ✓ Expand access to supported living options through Individual Service funds
- ✓ Reconfigure local commissioning
- ✓ Housing at the heart of community hubs
